## Community

El Rancho High School is located in the city of Pico Rivera. The city is a suburb of Los Angeles and is located 13 miles southeast of Los Angeles. El Rancho High School is the only comprehensive high school in a city of 63,522 with 91.2% of residents identifying themselves as ethnically Latino. Pico Rivera has an estimated 16,464 households with a median family income of \$55,203. El Rancho’s 2,345 students reflect the ethnic make-up of the city, which is 91% Latino. Approximately 61% of the students qualify for free/reduced lunch.

## Curriculum

The academic program is organized on a semester block schedule. Thirty-five credits per semester is the maximum course load. A minimum of 220 credits is required for graduation. ERHS is proud to be part of the first school district in California to require ethnic studies for graduation. ERHS is committed to providing students with an array of rigorous course offerings that meet college preparation requirements. ERHS is an AVID school, implementing AVID strategies school wide. This year, ERHS became an authorized International Baccalaureate Diploma Program School offering 6 IB courses, beginning with the class of 2020. In addition to IB, ERHS is offering 5 Honors courses and 21 AP courses.

ERHS offers seven different pathways in Engineering, Biomedical, Digital Arts, ROP Culinary Arts, Law, and ROP Healthcare and Sports Medicine. In addition, ERHS is in partnerships with Tri-Cities Regional Occupational Center, Rio Hondo College and CSU Long Beach, which provide students with dual enrollment opportunities for ROP and college courses.

## Grading & Ranking

- The grading system is on a 4.00, A-F system.
- All Honors/AP courses with a grade of C or better receive an extra point.
- Class rank is based upon semester grades and class rank is computed each semester.
- All the students in the class are ranked from highest G.P.A. to the lowest.

## Advanced Placement

- In May 2018, 625 students took AP Exams
- A total of 971 exams were taken in 21 subjects
- 49.1% of students who took AP Exam earned one or more scores of 3 or higher.
- 71 Students Earned AP Scholar Recognitions in 2018
- 53 AP Scholars, 10 AP Scholars with Honor, 8 AP Scholars with Distinction and 1 National AP Scholar
